Results

- Most pupils achieving Level 5+ in any subject at the end of KS3 are capable of achieving at least GCSE grade C in that subject
- Getting less than grade C is not necessarily a failure but...
- The majority of pupils in this year group should be aiming for 5+ A*-C grades at GCSE

**GCSE is the beginning,
not the end!**

Keeping Track of Progress

■ CAT Indicator Grade/FFT

- based on CATs test (Cognitive Abilities Test)
- National tests (NFER)
- indication of minimum expected GCSE grade (most subjects)
 - *only an indication – plenty of pupils have exceeded their CAT!*
 - *FFT grades link to KS2 results, we aspire to the top 25% of schools in the UK*

● Current Performance Grade

- teacher prediction based on current performance

■ Target Grade

- pupil's potential grade based on teacher judgment
