Year 11 Mentoring

Not in Employment Education or Training (NEET)

Figures that we have received from Connexions indicate that only 1.5% of the pupils from last year's Year 11 are not in employment, education or training. This is a very low figure compared to a national average of 7.3% last year. This is an indication of how committed our pupils are to learn and to work.
