

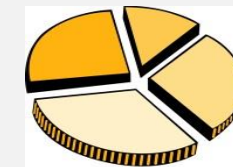

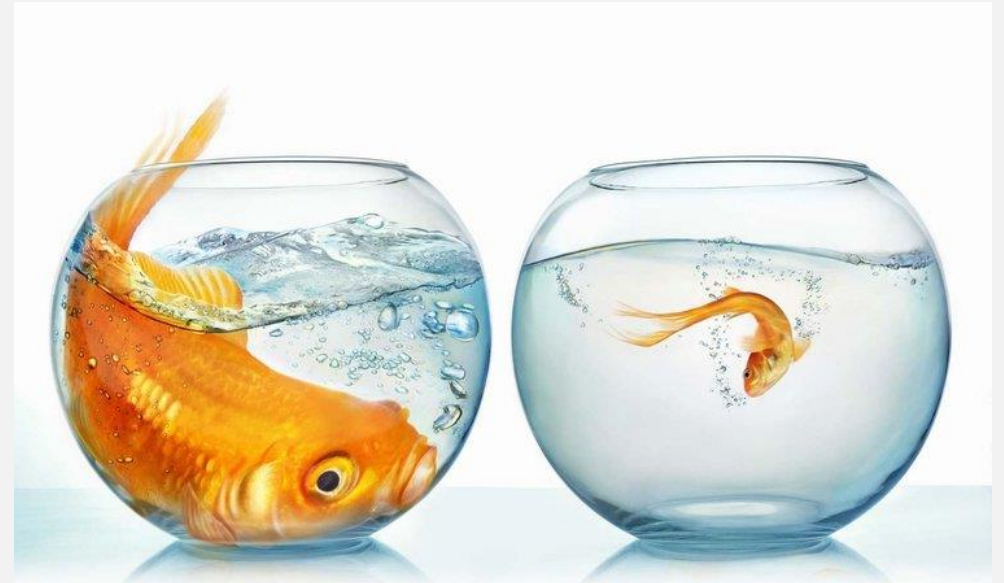
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Moving to Slough and Eton



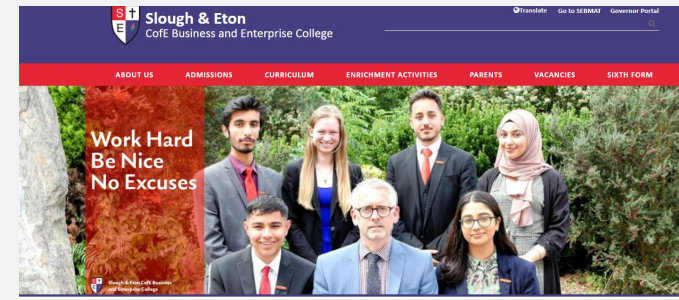
- So much is different:

Key changes at secondary school

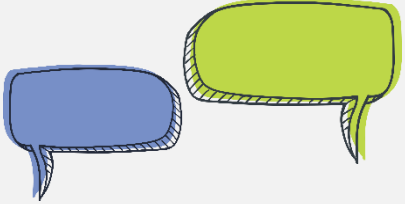
- Our expectations are built on those at primary/KS2 but we expect students be able to demonstrate a much higher degree of independence and personal responsibility.

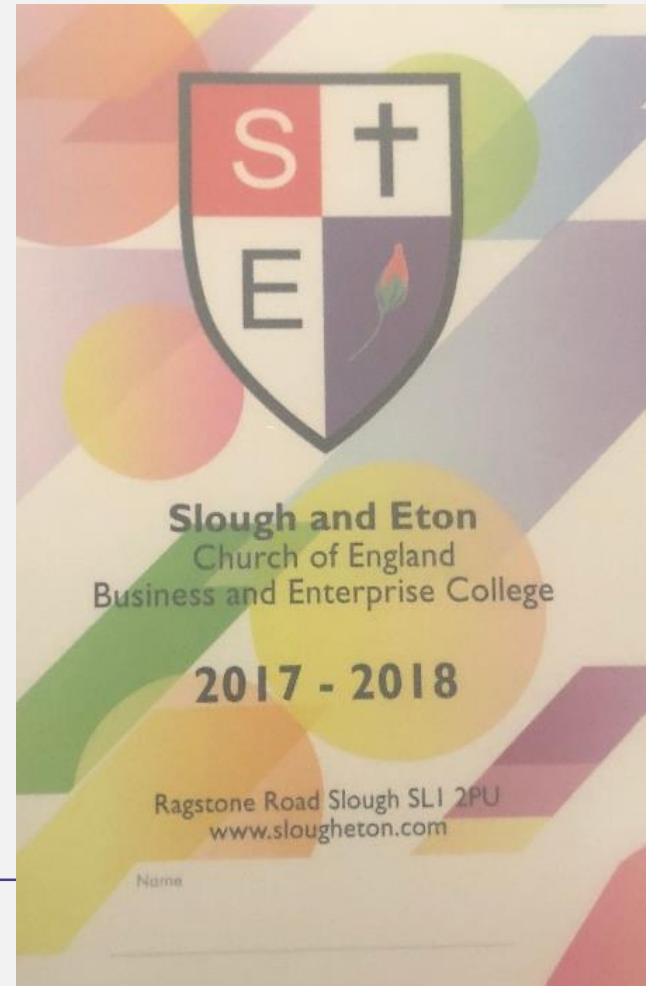

- Can be linked with other children at other schools.

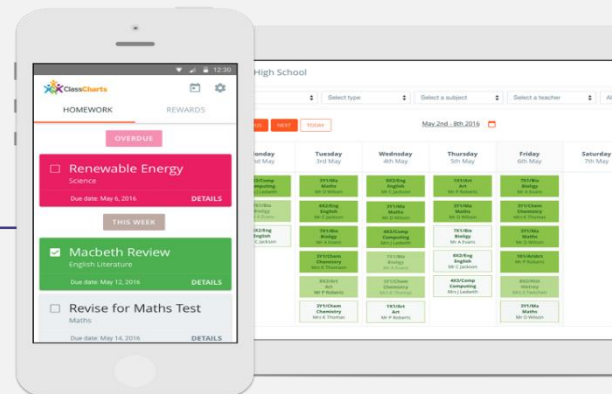

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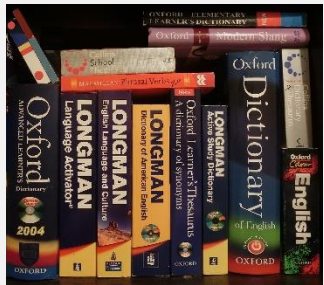

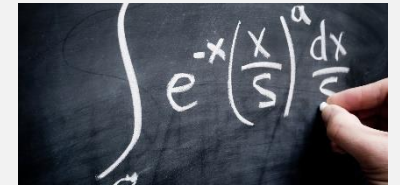

Slough and Eton School PE Kit

Presentation

- Jewellery is not permitted, except for one pair of plain studs or sleepers in ear and a wristwatch. This includes rings and bracelets.
- No nail varnish, fake nails or make-up are allowed.
- Shaved heads or extravagant haircuts are not permitted and only natural hair colours are allowed.
- All listed items of school uniform should be **clearly marked** with the student's name.



Behaviour

- Consistently positive behaviour is rewarded in a variety of ways.
- Unacceptable behaviour which breaks the school rules will always be sanctioned.



Slough and Eton School Rules

- All uniform to be worn correctly at all times.
- Students to arrive to lessons on time.
- Mobile phones are only to be used before school, at break, lunch and after school.
- Earphones are not to be worn unless it is a time when phones are allowed.
- Planners to be on the desk in every lesson.
- All students should have a reading book with them at all times.
- Water bottles brought into school should not be out during lessons.
- Work should be written in pen and drawings/diagrams in pencil.
- Students should put their hand up if they want help from a teacher.
- Students are not allowed to go to the toilet during lessons.
- Queue sensibly when waiting to buy food and drink.
- Manners are key – students should ensure they say please and thank you and display courteous behaviour such as holding doors open for others.
- Chewing gum is not allowed.
- When arriving to lessons go in as soon as the teacher asks you to and begin the 'Do Now' work at the back of your book.
- Move quickly between and to lessons and as soon as the warning bell goes.
- Attend detentions without making a fuss or excuses.



Punctuality and Attendance

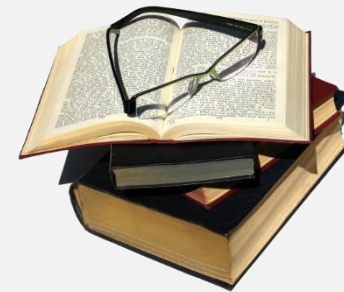
- Students must be in school, in classroom at 8.30am.
- Students are to arrive on time to every lesson.
- Punctuality and attendance is monitored. Attendance target is 96%.
- You must contact the school if your child is absent.
- Appointments should be scheduled outside of school time. If this is not possible, please notify the school and write in student planner.

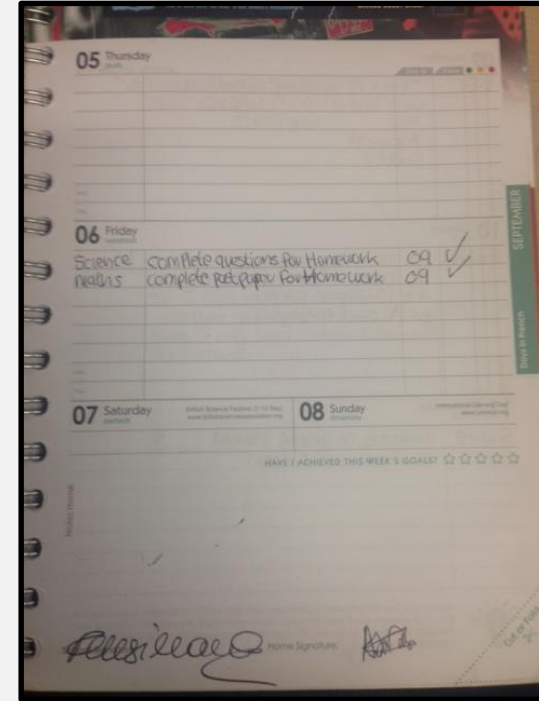
We require all students to bring the following items to school each day:

Mobile Phones



- Mobiles are permitted in school but are the responsibility of the student.

- Mobiles will be confiscated if misused and parents will have to pick the phone up from Reception at the end of the school day.

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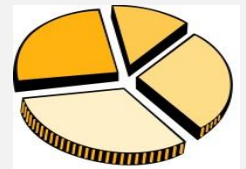

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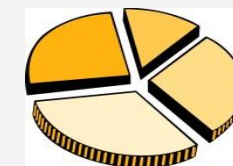


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WHY DO WE WANT IMPROVED READING LEVELS?

- Improved vocabulary, better writing and spelling.
- Reading needed for all subjects, including maths and science.
- New GCSE exams require students to have higher reading abilities – ‘young people who read daily are four times more likely to read above the expected for their age’ – Doug Lemov. The average expected reading age for a GCSE paper is 15 years—across all subjects!
- Better grades result in better prospects for further education and jobs.
- Higher earnings!



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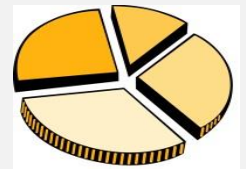
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STAR Reading Test and Accelerated Reader

- On-line test in first few days.
- Reading age – in years and months.
- Reading range – ZPD e.g. 3.2 – 4.5
- Read books at the correct level.
- Read a book – take an online quiz - pass quiz, gain points.
- Points target to meet each term.
- Excellent proven results.



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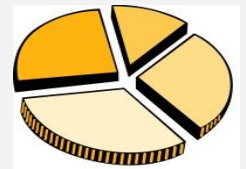
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What can I do to help my child succeed?

- Reading is a skill that needs to be practised.
- Reading every day – at least 20 minutes.
- Supportive home environment.
- Be a role model.
- Discuss books and reading. Ask questions about what they're reading.
- 'Never forget that reading gives you knowledge, which gives you choice and opportunity in whatever you want to do in life' (Andy McNab, *Today Everything Changes*, p.80).



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Summer School: August 23 - 27

- We will be holding a summer school to help students prepare for joining us in September.
- Students will be able to meet the Form Tutor, others in their Form groups and across the Year Group.
